1	Introduction to the Dimensions of Long-Term Care	Updated statistics on the consumers of long-term services and supports. Expanded discussion of long-term care consumers, including information on younger long- term care consumers (ages 18 to 64) and individuals with chronic or disabling conditions. Added discussion of informal sources of support such as family caregivers. Discussion of ageism and ableism. Coverage of the creation of the Administration for Community Living (ACL), reauthorization of the Older Americans Act, and the White House Conference on Aging.
2	Delivering Long-Term Services and Supports Under the Affordable Care Act – NEW CHAPTER	Topics covered include the shift in focus from institutional to community-based care, ACA initiatives to improve long-term care services for vulnerable populations, the focus on improving care transitions, and provisions to reform nursing home care.
3	Transitions of Care and Post-Acute Care Services – NEW CHAPTER	Topics covered include the types of care transitions, the role of post-acute care services in transitions of care, legislation affecting care transitions, and the development of new interventions. Provides an evaluation of transition services related to health outcomes.
4	Residential Settings for Long-Term Care Services (formerly Chapter 2)	Updated statistics on residential long-term care services. Expanded discussion of person-centered care and the culture change movement in nursing homes.
5	Home and Community-Based Services and Supports (formerly Chapter 3)	Updated statistics. Expanded discussion of the evolution of services for people with disabilities, including the creation of the Administration for Community Living (ACL).
6	Technology and Delivery in Long-Term Care Services (formerly Chapter 4)	Coverage of the regulatory environment, including the HITECH Act and meaningful use. Expanded information on assistive technology and electronic health records.
7	Hospice, Palliative, and End-of-Life Care (formerly Chapter 6)	Coverage of the ACA and the Medicare Hospice Benefit; the passage of Death with Dignity laws; and research on the impact of palliative and hospice care on hospital readmissions and patients' quality of life.

8	Chronic and Disabling Conditions and Long-Term Care (formerly Chapter 5)	Chapter expanded beyond Alzheimer's to include other chronic health conditions. Added overview of common and disabling conditions and care management implications. Discussion of managing care of individuals with multiple chronic conditions.
9	Diversity in the Delivery of Long-Term Care Services (formerly Chapter 7)	Diversity definition expanded to include gender identity, geographic location, and military service. New discussion of long-term health needs of older veterans and rural elders.
10	Global Trends in Long-Term Care Policies and Services – NEW CHAPTER	Describes global trends in population aging and discusses their implications for long-term care policies and services around the world. Examines how government-funded, public long-term care policies and programs have been established in Sweden, Japan, Germany, the United States, Australia, and China.
11	Management and Leadership in Long-Term Care Settings (formerly Chapter 8)	New discussion of risk management and business continuity planning. Added definitions for situational, transformational, and collaborative leadership styles. Expanded discussion of quality assessment and performance improvement. New case study and accompanying questions.
12	The Design of Long-Term Care Environments (formerly Chapter 9)	Added definition and discussion of environmental gerontology. Coverage of memory care units and animal therapy for dementia residents. Expanded discussion of the National Fire Protection Agency and its Life Safety Code. New case study and accompanying questions.
13	Strategic Marketing for Long-Term Care (formerly Chapter 10)	Expanded discussion of using social media to build relationships with potential customers. Added discussion of tracking marketing effectiveness. Revised case study and accompanying questions.
14	Long-Term Care Human Resources (formerly Chapter 11)	Expanded discussion of workforce challenges related to direct care workers, including discussion of how the ACA impacts workforce issues.
15	Legal and Ethical Issues in Long-Term Care (formerly Chapter 12)	Expanded discussion of ethical issues, with a focus on elder abuse prevention and resident rights. New case study and accompanying questions.
16	The Regulation of Long-Term Care (formerly Chapter 16)	Added definition and discussion of the Quality Indicator Survey (QIS). Updated information on campaigns for nursing home quality.
17	Quality and Safety in Long-Term Care – NEW CHAPTER	Examines quality in long-term care settings; quality improvement tools and methods; and reform-driven requirements for safety and quality.
18	Financing and Reimbursement of Long-Term Care Services (formerly Chapter 14)	Expanded discussion of private sources of payment for long-term care services. New coverage of financial management tools for long-term care administrators. Discussion of ACA financing and delivery initiatives.
